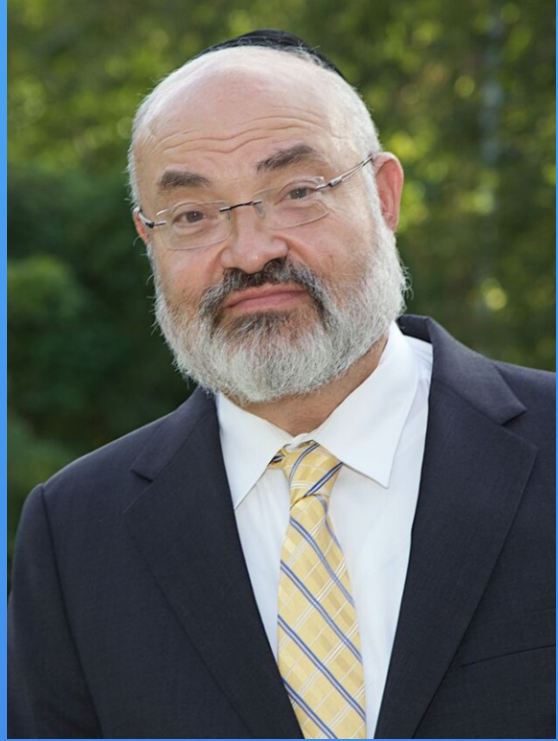


Young Israel of Fort Lee Scholar-in-Residence

Rabbi Dr. Dovid Katz is the Rabbi of Congregation Beth Abraham of Baltimore, Maryland, and a Professor of History at the Johns Hopkins University (Dept. of Near-Eastern Studies). A former Contributing Editor to the Artscroll Schottenstein Edition of the Babylonian Talmud and a popular speaker, Rabbi Katz lectures widely on Jewish History as well as on Rabbinic Literature. Rabbi Katz's lectures on Jewish history in Baltimore draw hundreds of people from a cross section of Baltimore's Jewish community. Rabbi Katz's translation of the Aramaic Igeres Rav Sherira Gaon of 987 CE was recently published by ArtScroll as an introduction to their edition of the Babylonian Talmud.
